

#### CHAIRMAN'S FOREWORD

Welcome to all in the 2004 Ben Nevis Race!

The 2003 Race saw 379 runners start and finish without serious incident. Our entry into the electronic age has paid dividends for us. The wrist tagging was a great success with minor problems — it is still too expensive an exercise for us to have as standard. The committee now know, however, what is involved after last year's experiment and is keeping a close eye on developments of this kind for the future.

Thanks to Entries Sec George and Web wizard Aitken Scott, our website is up and running and, I believe, has cut down on snail mail, thus making life a lot easier for all involved. The sincere thanks of the committee and myself go out to Alex Brett (running number 21) who is competing this year for a Connochie Plaque (21 completed races). To mark this occasion Alex's firm has sponsored this year's race which has allowed us to enhance this printed booklet and have some other novel improvements besides giving our treasurer some extra uninterrupted sleep.

This year we are delighted to welcome back to the Race Kenny Stuart and Pauline Haworth of Keswick AC, the current holders of the Ben Nevis Race records. Kenny and Pauline, now married, have held these records since 1984. It is great to mark the twentieth anniversary by having Kenny and Pauline as our guests to start the race and present the prizes in the Nevis centre at 8pm (same venue as last year). To mark this occasion and to highlight this record achievement, a bounty prize of £1000 for breaking either record has been tendered. So, there is no excuse—the path on the Ben has been improved since Kenny and Pauline's day and even the road to Achintee has been resurfaced!

Sadly, I have to report on the deaths during the year of three important Ben Race personalities. The two runners Brian Kearney and Jimmy Conn will have been known to many runners here today and both leave a legacy of dedication to and enthusiasm for hill-running that has been the inspiration of so many young local runners. Jimmy's family have kindly donated a trophy in his memory which will be awarded annually to the third placed runner which, incidentally was Jimmy's best placing. Our third sad loss this year was that of Honorary President Charlie Fitzsimons. Charlie was an institution on the B.N.R.A. committee and is being sadly missed. An appreciation of these three great characters appears elsewhere in this booklet.

You may notice that we have some poetry in this issue. This has been organised by our own indefatigable Leen, the purpose of which is to generate interest within the younger school community in the Ben and racing thereon. This it certainly has done — perhaps the prize of a free entry to the race ( to be used if/when the winner qualifies) — was the incentive for such fine efforts. Finally, may I wish you all a great run, especially those doing their first Ben Nevis and those from overseas. Thank you all for entering as it is you, the runners, who make this race a great race and a memorable day.


#### Secretary's Notes



#### **OBITUARIES**

As we arrive at the 53<sup>rd</sup> Anniversary of The Ben Nevis Race Association it is inevitable that the characters who, from the early days, helped to make 'The Ben Race' the institution that it has become, pass on from our midst. That inevitability does not soften the blow of the race losing three great friends during the past 12 months.

BRIAN KEARNEY Brian was the winner of the first race of the modern era in 1951. A supreme athlete, Brian Kearney's name will forever be linked with 'The Ben Race' but perhaps surprisingly he only ran four races. However the local favourite, whose strength lay in his fearless descents, won three of those races and, but for a genuine hard luck story, he could have had a 100% record. When descending in 1956 one of Brian's famous baseball boots burst open. He carried on barefooted until borrowing a pair of tackety boots from a spectator to finish in a creditable fourth place. Stung by the fact that the first prize had gone out of Lochaber for the first time, Brian returned in 1957 to annihilate a, then, record entry with an eight minute winning margin. Brian was the holder of many hill — racing records, not least 'The Three Peaks' His advice, freely given, was sought by many runners over the years.

JIMMY CONN Jimmy was possibly the most consistent performer in the race during the 1950s. From 1952 until 1960 he has seven top 10 finishes, with his best position being third in 1952 and 1960. It is appropriate that the Conn family has donated a trophy in Jimmy's memory which will be presented each year to the third-placed runner. Jimmy was a valuable member of Lochaber Athletic Club and it was due to his excellent runs allied to the high positions of Brian Kearney and Eddie Campbell that secured many team victories for the local club. In his latter years ill health prevented Jimmy from attending race day but he remained a staunch friend of the event and was always keen to hear news of the race.

CHARLIE FITZSIMONS Charlie was an institution within The Ben Race Association and his involvement went back to 1951 when as a young man he was a willing helper on the field and at the post-race marquee dances which raised much needed income. He soon became a valued committee member and during 52 years of unbroken service Charlie built up an encyclopaedic memory of events and personalities surrounding the race. Over a post meeting dram, and Charlie must have attended nearly 500 in his time, his anecdotes would make attendance worthwhile and certainly shortened the winter. At future AGMs it will fall to somebody else to open up 'other competent business' on the agenda with "Has the park been booked for this year's race?" Charlie will be missed for his pawky humour and today's field organisers will miss his arrival on the park to check that the start-line is, to the centimetre, in the correct place. With £1000 of the Association's money at stake for the record to be broken, Charlie may have already checked the line for us.







